## Foresthill Repairs Pipeline During Mosquito Fire

Foresthill Public Utility District's staff repaired three leaks during the Mosquito fire but did not have any water quality issues or water shortages. Two of the leaks were on a pipeline near Sierra View Lane. The pipeline was damaged during heavy fire activity on September 13th. This entire pipeline is scheduled to be replaced during the Foresthill Road Pipeline Replacement Project this fall.



The water treatment plant is currently operating at a normal flow rate for this time of year and staff is restocking emergency supplies depleted during the fire.

## Foresthill Road Pipeline Replacement Project Continues



Foresthill has ensured it is safe for contractors to continue work after the Mosquito Fire with minimal encumbrance to the public. We realized how important this revitalized project is.
