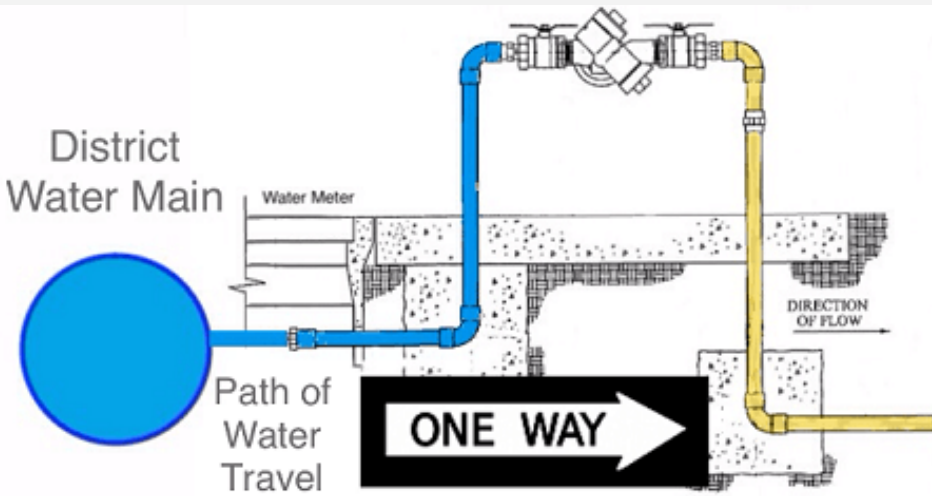

Annual Backflow Prevention Device Testing Due

Do I have a backflow device?

- The State of California requires most commercial businesses and some residences to install a backflow prevention device to protect the public drinking water supply from contamination by ensuring water flows only in one direction. This summer BSI will be sending out reminder letters to customers who require annual tests.

Why do I have to test my backflow device?

- State regulations require that backflow devices be tested annually. A backflow prevention device protects the public water system by preventing contamination.

WATERING TIPS FOR THE GARDEN, LAWN, & LANDSCAPE

Top Five Watering Tips

- Watering in cooler temperatures can reduce monthly water consumption.
- Using drip irrigation and/or a smart controller can prevent overwatering.
- This allows the water to soak into the soil and be absorbed by the plants before it evaporates.
- It's a great step to improve water efficiency in landscape irrigation if you irrigate your yard early or late at night.
- Once you've programmed a water timer, you won't have to worry about watering your plants regularly.
